Gynaecological cancers are named according to the organ or part of the body where they first develop – that is, the ovary, uterus, cervix, vagina or vulva: Ovarian cancer affects the ovaries, a pair of solid, oval-shaped organs producing hormones and eggs (ova). Uterine cancer
