Identify the negative or disruptive behavior (one or two behaviors). Identify the times when the negative or disruptive behavior occurs in the classroom. Identify fixed time intervals through the course of the day in which you will assess to see if your student is engaging in negative behavior.

Strategies to manage or change behaviour in schools can involve school-wide, classroom- based or individual child-focused interventions: the focus of this paper is on classroom-based interventions derived from Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA), which involves the application of the principles of operant conditioning (Skinner, 1953) to socially relevant human behaviours (Baer, Wolf & Risley, 1968).
