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College Textbook Chapter Summaries

At the start of each chapter there will be a summary page. This will list out areas of focus and help clarify what exactly it is that this chapter is about. At the beginning or the end of each chapter or sub section in the textbook, there will be a section listing the learning outcome of this chapter. This is the section you read first.

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Writing Summaries A summary is a short overview of the main points of a text. The purpose of a summary is to quickly give the reader or listener an idea of what this material is saying.

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Textbook chapters often include a preview paragraph before the first bolded headline. Before getting into the real content of the chapter, write down a summary of this preview paragraph in the outline. Your goal here is to give yourself a good idea of what the chapter is about. This particular preview paragraph is short.

If you want to take notes from a textbook, read through each section of the assigned chapter first, then summarize the main points. Include 1-3 of the most important details of the section, reading through the text again if you need to.

Outlining a textbook chapter is not just copying down the first sentence of every paragraph or every heading. A good outline demonstrates understanding of the material and an ability to identify and summarize its main points.
