In France, Baroque and Rococo were adjacent stylistic periods that encompassed two entirely distinct sensibilities; one (Baroque) was heavy-handed and provocative, while the other (Rococo) expressed lightness and playfulness with elaborate decoration.

The Rococo style was fashionable from 1730 to 1770. While it started in France, it eventually spread to other parts of Europe, including the United Kingdom, Austria, Germany, Bavaria, and Russia. The term Rococo is derived from *rocaille*, a special method of decorating fountains and grottoes that dates back to the Italian Renaissance.

Rococo (/ rəˈkɒʊkəʊ /, also US: / ˌrɒʊkəˈkɒʊ /), less commonly Roccoco or Late Baroque, is an exceptionally ornamental and theatrical style of architecture, art and decoration which combines asymmetry, scrolling curves, gilding, white and pastel colors, sculpted molding, and *trompe l'oeil* frescoes to create surprise and the illusion of motion and drama.

With Watteau, French art began the move from the grandeur of baroque art towards the smaller-scale and more intimate style known as rococo. A contemporary of Watteau, and another genre painter though not at all in the same genre, was Jean Siméon Chardin (1699 - 1779).
