Career Counseling discusses that A largely verbal process in which a counselor and counselee (s) are in a dynamic and collaborative relationship, focused on identifying and acting on the counselee's goals, in which the counselor employs a repertoire of diverse techniques and processes, to help bring about self-understanding, Understanding of behavioral options available, and informed decision-making in the counselee, who has the responsibility for his or her own actions (Herr & Cramer, 1996).

Counselling Theories and Approaches

Narrative career counseling moves away from a scientific approach that is exemplified by the matching of relatively static personality traits with job factors. Narrative approaches recognize that as dynamic social actors individuals speak, act, and interpret events through their particular contexts and cultures.

Based on holistic approach, constructivism emphasizes the self-organizing principles underlying human experience. The decision to use a constructivist framework for career counseling resulted from the observation that youth often were not lacking career information; instead, they did not feel empowered or motivated to put the information to use.
